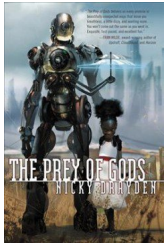


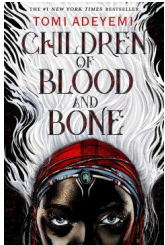

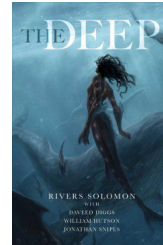
The prey of gods

In a futuristic South Africa where technology and a booming economy make life more comfortable, a Zulu girl becomes her community's defender.



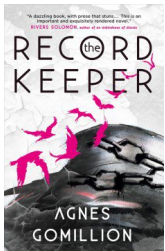
Akata witch

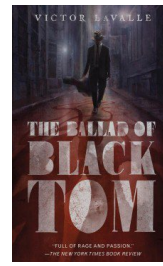
Children of blood and bone

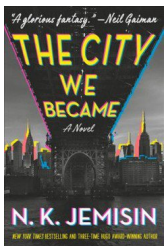
The deep

The historian of the water-dwelling descendants of pregnant African slaves thrown overboard by slavers keeps all the memories of her people both painful and miraculous.



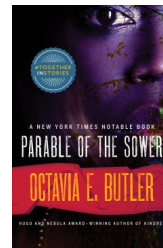
The record keeper

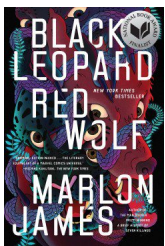
The ballad of Black Tom

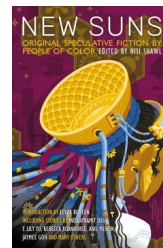
The city we became
