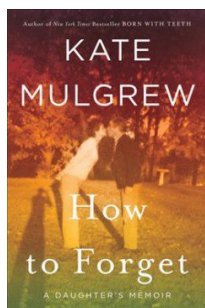


Can't we talk about something more pleasant?: a memoir

A graphic memoir celebrates the final years of Chast's aging parents' lives through cartoons, family photos and documents that reflect

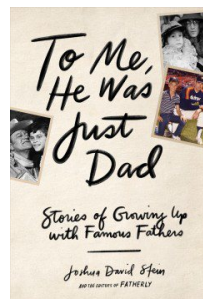
the artist's struggles with caregiver challenges.

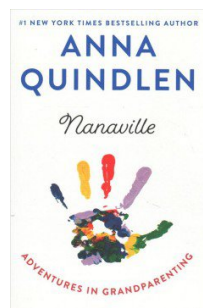

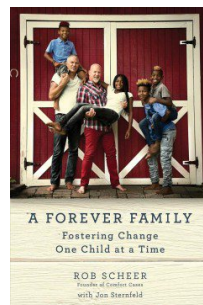
