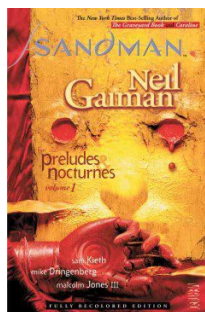

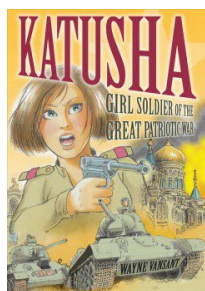

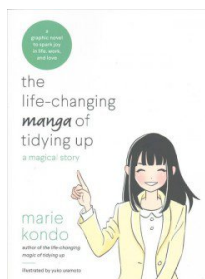


Katusha: girl soldier of the Great Patriotic War

glory...and even love.

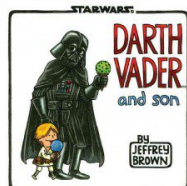


The life-changing manga of tidying up: a magical story

In this comic reimagining, Darth Vader is a dad like any other--except with all the baggage of being the Dark Lord of the Sith.

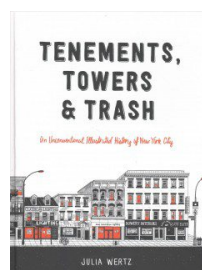


The boy, the mole, the fox and the horse

"Kind," said the boy.

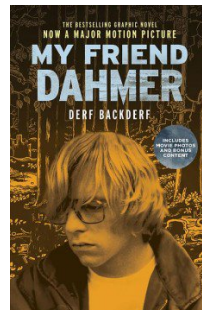


Tenements, towers & trash: an unconventional illustrated history of New York City

A historical, graphic tour of New York highlights lesser-known stories from the city's past and features then-and-now illustrations of

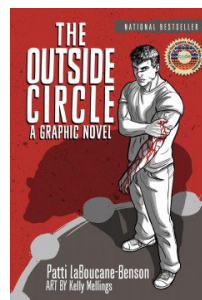
