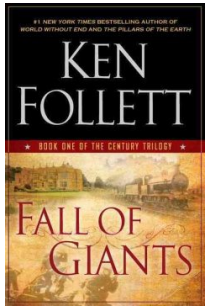

by Ken Follett

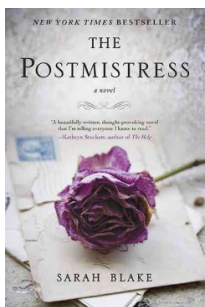

by Lisa See

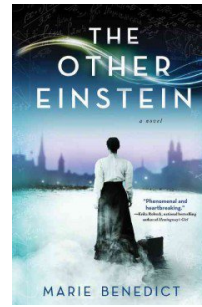
Set against the backdrop of China in the 1800s, when women suffered from foot binding, isolation, and illiteracy, an elderly woman and her companion share their lives through a secret language.

by Sarah Blake

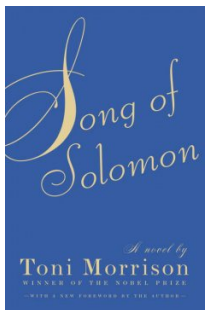

by Marie Benedict

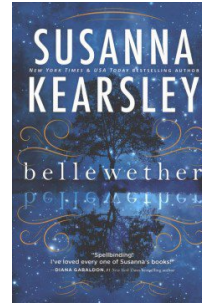

by Toni Morrison

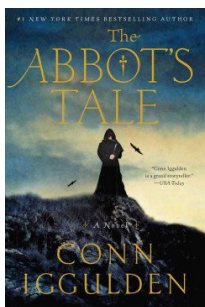

by Susanna Kearsley

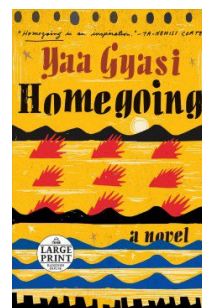
