

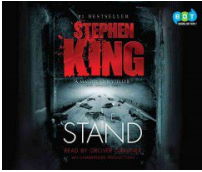

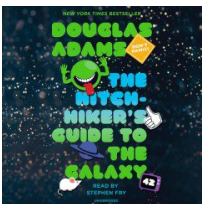
The stand

a battle between good and evil, move toward an actual confrontation as they migrate to Boulder, Colorado. (TW)



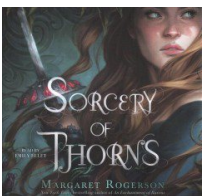
The poet X

galactic traveler Arthur Dent. (TW)

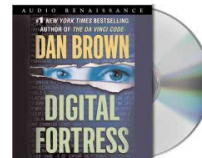


Sorcery of thorns

A founding apprentice raised in one of her kingdom's great libraries finds her fate in the hands of a sworn enemy when she is

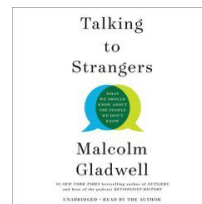
implicated in an act of sabotage behind the release of a dangerous grimoire. (TLS)



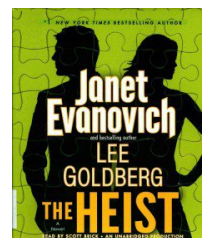
Red, white & royal blue
