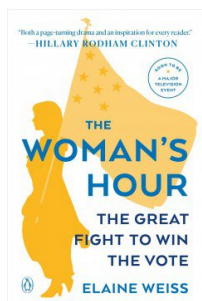

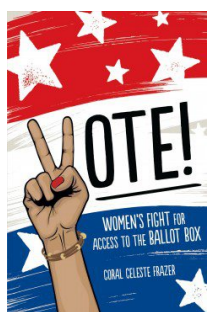


## The woman's hour: the great fight to win the vote

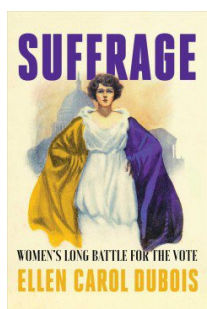

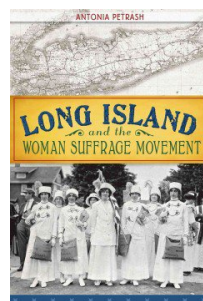


## Suffrage: women's long battle for the vote

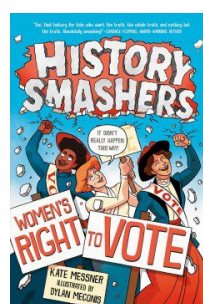


## Long Island and the woman suffrage movement

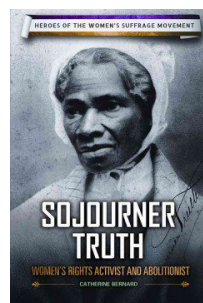


## Women's right to vote
